Barcelona is the:

- largest ecosystem for startups in Southern Europe
- second-favorite hub of founders wishing to create a startup in the EU
- second-largest startup hub with the highest number of founders from local universities in the EU

- third-largest startup hub in the EU, with greater connectivity on a global scale
- **fifth-largest ecosystem** in the EU in terms of the **number of scaleups**
- fifth-largest hub in the EU in terms of funding rounds attracted by startups in venture capital in the 2019-2023 period



Barcelona is renowned as the main startup ecosystem in Southern Europe

StartupBlink has recently acknowledged Barcelona as the best startup ecosystem in Southern Europe.






Barcelona is the second-favorite hub of founders wishing to create a startup in the EU

EU cities that are most attractive for the creation of startups

Barcelona is the second-favorite hub of founders wishing to create a startup in the EU 17% of founders regard the city as an attractive hub. Barcelona has remained in this position for the last seven years.




Barcelona is the startup hub with the second-highest number of founders from local universities in the EU

EU cities with the highest number of founders from local universities

1,887 startup founders in Barcelona come from Catalan universities. This makes it the **EU city with the second-highest number of founders from local universities** and reinforces the increasingly entrepreneurial nature of Catalonia's university fabric.



2. Main features of startups in Catalonia, 2023





Main features of startups in Catalonia, 2023

- The **2,102 startups** identified in **2023** almost double those in **2016**, the year in which the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub was created.
- 48% of the startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub have been created in the last five years.
- 86.7% of the startups are located in the Metropolitan Area of Barcelona (MAB).
- The healthtech, business services, ICT and mobile, e-commerce and food sectors account for more than 48% of the startups.
- 71% of the startups work with technologies linked to Industry 4.0.

- Catalonia has **320 deep tech startups**, **15.2% of the total**, with **213** identified **spin-offs**.
- 52% of the deep tech startups have a patent or knowledge protection system.
- 91% of the startups declare that they invest in R&D and 38% assign more than 50% of their income to it.
- 41% of the startups promote some kinds of action to prioritize sustainability (last year the percentage was 34%).




The Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub identifies more and more startups in Catalonia every year. The number of startups in the Catalan ecosystem has almost doubled since the creation of the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub, rising from 1,086 startups in 2016 to 2,102 in 2023, an increase of 93.6%.

Between **2022** and **2023**, the number of startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub has risen by 4%.



In keeping with what we regard as a startup, companies over 10 years old and those that have ceased their activity are excluded from the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub.

Number of startups Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub (2016-2023)









86.7% of the startups in Catalonia are located in the Metropolitan Area of Barcelona (AMB)

The region that accounts for the most startups is **El Barcelonès** (67.9%), followed by **El Vallès Occidental** (9.8%), **El Baix Llobregat** (5.9%) and **El Maresme** (3.1%).




4.0 technologies predominate in the startups

Top 15 tecnologies (percentage of startups)

71% of the startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub work with technologies linked to Industry 4.0. We should highlight, above all, the 31% of startups that use artificial intelligence & big data as their main technologies.



Industry 4.0 it encompasses the following technologies: artificial intelligence and big data, automation, cloud, IoT and sensors, immersive technologies and digital entertainment, robotics, frontier materials, connectivity, blockchain, cybersecurity, quantum and photonic sciences and simulation/digital twin.



There are 213 identified spin-offs at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub


There are **213 identified spin-offs** at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub, 10.1% of all the startups. The number has increased by 21% compared to the figure of 176 in 2022.

31% of the spin-offs at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub **originate from CERCA centers** and **28.5**% from **universities**. **3.5**% of the total number of **spin-offs** are linked to TECNIO* centers accredited by ACCIÓ.



Spin-offs are companies promoted by members of the university or research community which base their activity on the exploitation of new processes, products and services developed upon the basis of the knowledge and results obtained at the university or research center.






Patents and knowledge protection systems are present in 52% of the startups

Startups with patents and knowledge protection systems

52% of the startups declare that they have a patent or knowledge protection system. Of the above, **31%** declare that they have some **protection in the Spanish sphere** and **60% in the international sphere.****



91% of the startups declare that they **invest** in **R&D**.

55% of the startups declare that they invest more than 25% of their income in R&D, and 38% assign more than 50% of their income to R&D.



3. Economic importance and talent in startups





Economic and talent importance to startups in the Catalan ecosystem

- The startup ecosystem in Catalonia employs more than **20,600 workers, 8% more** than the previous year.
- The number of **workers** in the Catalan startup ecosystem has practically doubled since the creation of the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hubel 2016 with a **110**% increase.
- **32**% of the startups had more than 10 workers in 2022.
- The startup ecosystem in Catalonia invoices more than €2,100M, 14.5% higher than in 2021.

- 38% of the startups invoice over €500,000.
- 68% of the startups in Catalonia export
- 24% of the workers are foreign nationals.
- 54% of the startup founders have prior experience of the creation of companies.






The startup ecosystem in Catalonia employs more than 20,600 workers

The number of jobs grew by 8% compared to the previous year and exceeded 20,600 workers for the first time.

The **number of workers** in the Catalan startup ecosystem has practically **doubled** since the creation of the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub, rising from 9,819 workers in 2014 to 20,665 in 2022.




Employment of startups, by employment segments: startups are gaining in size

In 2022, the startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub **employed 20,665 people.**

32% of the startups had **more than 10 workers** in 2022. In 2020, this percentage stood at 18%. The proportion of those with 5 or fewer workers has fallen from 66% to 50%. This means that startups in Catalonia are gaining size.




The startup ecosystem in Catalonia invoices more than 2,100 million euros

In 2022, the startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub invoiced €2,112M, representing a 14.5% increase compared to the figure of the previous year.

The **turnover** of startups in Catalonia has increased by **94% in the last seven years**. It has risen from 1,091 million euros in 2015 to 2,112 million euros in 2022.




Turnover of startups by invoicing tranches; the startups are maintaining their size, despite the economic context

In 2022, the startups at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub **invoiced €2,112M**, representing a **14.5% increase** compared to the figure of the previous year.

38% of the startups **invoiced more than €500,000** in 2022. In 2020, this percentage stood at 26%.


Internationalization of startups in the Catalan ecosystem

Export startups (%)






Argentina (12.7%) and Italy (12.4%) are the two countries cited most often by startups as the countries of origin of their foreign workers.




More than half of the startups have founders with prior experience

54% of the startups in the Catalan ecosystem have a **founder with prior experience** in the creation of startups.

This figure has risen in recent years; the percentage was 45% in 2020 and 52% in 2021. It has increased by 9 percentage points in the last 2 years.

4. Funding of startups





Funding of startups

- Between 2019 and 2023, the investment received by Catalan startups has totaled €5,276M, 231% higher than that raised in the previous five-year period (€1,594 million).
- In 2023, startups in Catalonia have closed 288 funding rounds worth 688, 17.5% more than last year.
- In 2023 financing rounds up to series A in Catalonia have grown by 12%, while in Europe they have decreased by 18%.
- Although there were **no mega rounds in 2023** in line with the global trend, **early stage** investments **continued** to be very **active** in Catalonia in 2023.

- In 2023, the international economy has been marked by uncertainty and the war context, which has caused private investors to be more cautious when investing globally.
- The **healthtech** sector has attracted the **highest volume of investment** in 2023 (18%).
- 95% of the startups claim to have received private funding in the last 3 years.
- At some time, **three out of four startups** at the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub have secured funding. **45**% of startups have closed a round of funding **in the last 3 years**.
- 26% of the startups have received investment rounds totaling over a million euros (series A+B+C).



Catalan startups have attracted investment totaling €5,276M in five years

The investment received by startups in Catalonia in the last five years (€5,276M) is 231% higher than that received in the previous five-year period (€1,594M), reflecting the increasing strength of the ecosystem.






Sectors of Catalan startups that have attracted the highest investment volume in 2023

Healthtech is clearly the sector that has attracted the highest volume of investment in 2023 (18%), followed by **housing** (13%), **transportation** (10%) and **fintech** (10%).

Catalonia, benchmark in the EIC Accelerator, 2023

Catalonia has raised more than 22.7 million euros during the first semester of the 2023 EIC Accelerator call. In the June 2023 call, 47 companies were selected to receive funding from the EIC Accelerator. Of these, 3 are Spanish, and 100% are Catalan.

European public entities continue to bet on high-tech companies, where Catalonia is very well positioned, and support them with funding.




Funding phases of the startups



Have you completed a funding round in the last 3 years?





- 5. It provides the options of filtering spin-offs and meeting its public participants.
- 6. It includes links to contributors and online information sources.
- 7. Registration is possible by using a data form.





Objectives of the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub

- 1. To identify Catalan startups that meet the requirements* to form part of the web directory.
- 2. To position the Catalan startup ecosystem abroad. We want Catalonia to be known as a first-rate technological hub for business and investment.
- 3. To display investment opportunities to investors.
- 4. To promote corporate venturing operations between large companies and startups (as a source of cutting-edge technology).
- 5. To drive collaboration and synergies between startups.
- 6. To obtain better knowledge of startups on an aggregate scale so as to design and execute the most appropriate public policy for this collective.
- 7. To position ACCIÓ Catalonia Trade & Investment as the most important agent promoting technological entrepreneurship, innovation, the internationalization of Catalan companies and the attraction of foreign investment.

Which companies form part of the Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub?

A startup is a company:

- With a company tax ID number (not self-employed workers).
- Which is created by entrepreneurs with a desire to make it grow (ambition).
- Which is recently created (less than 10 years since its date of incorporation) and with a finished product to sell.
- Which is scalable and with high-growth potential, with the ability to grow quickly without being hindered by its structure or its available resources (time and money).
- Which is highly innovative or technological and aimed at the global market.
- Which does not provide consulting or software/app development services solely on customer demand, as it has its own products. Nor is it a website/landing page without any activity.
- Spin-offs are companies promoted by members of the university or research community which base their activity on the exploitation of new processes, products and services developed upon the basis of the knowledge and results obtained at the university or research center,

A company ceases to be a startup when:

- It is acquired by a corporation and trades on the stock market (exit).
- The founders no longer have management functions and have become mere shareholders.
- It remains inactive for more than 1 year.

The new law promoting the startup ecosystem of December 2022 regards startups as newly-created companies or any less than 5 years old (7 years in the case of companies devoted to biotechnology, energy, industry and other strategic sectors or any that have developed proprietary technology fully designed in Spain) which are independent of other companies, do not trade on a stock market, do not distribute or have not distributed profits, are innovative and have an annual turnover of up to 5 million euros.






Regular updates of the startup directory

The Barcelona & Catalonia Startup Hub was created in 2016. It is regularly updated as new startups ask to join it on the "add your startup" form, following validation by an internal ACCIÓ committee. This validation is also necessary when the search for new startups is performed proactively by ACCIÓ. The companies invited to form part of it must abide by the same process as those that apply autonomously.
